What is jumping Equitation?

Essentially, Dressage over Jumps! Combinations complete a course of jumps which is judged on Rhythm, Technique and Balance. Each area is scored and any fences knocked down or refusals are penalised. The focus is on the riders position, flow of the course, harmony with the horse.

VENUE: Your own arena or a venue compliant with the current Covid-19 restrictions.

ENTRIES CLOSE: Tuesday 3rd NOVEMBER 8PM. All videos must be posted under the correct section on the Sale and District Adult Riding Club Facebook page by 8PM Tuesday 3rd November.

Late entries will not be accepted.

Results will be posted by Tuesday 10th November

ENTRY FEE: \$15 per horse. Includes postage of score sheet at the completion of the event

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:

- Competitors must follow Covid safe procedures and restrictions
- Entries must be filmed after opening of entries and before close of entries. Footage may NOT be used for multiple competitions.
- HRCVA rules apply (Refer to HRCVA Manual).
- No Dogs in the competition arena
- Show Jumping rules apply (Refer to HRCVA Manual). Particular attention should be paid to Rules 11-17 regarding Obstacles & their construction. Failure to abide by these rules will result in elimination
- Jumps must not exceed the maximum dimensions set out Section Six of Show Jumping rules. Jumps shall be no lower than 5cm below the maximum dimensions. Riders jumping fences outside these conditions will be eliminated.
- The course should consist of minimum 6 jumping efforts, including a minimum of 2 Spread fences, 2 Vertical fences and 1 combination of 1-2 strides. The start and finish should be clearly marked.
- Rounds to be videoed from a minimum 1 metre from arena edge. Zoom as required to assist judging. Sound must be 'ON'. Landscape not portrait.
- ***Start video at Halt, progress through walk, trot and canter then proceed to jumping round. Following the finish flags return to walk. (similar to what the judge would see at an actual competition after you have presented)***
- Post your videos on the Sale and District Adult Riding Club Facebook page in the relevant sections. Please include your name, Club and Horses name and office Number with the video.

- Combinations to compete at their assessed level for Showjumping. A copy of your current valid membership & Showjumping Performance card must be forwarded to Card Secretary before competing. This can be done either by email shadyoakequestrian@gmail.com or via text message to 0439468523
- It is the rider's responsibility to have correct Gear fitted as per HRCav. Incorrect gear will lead to disqualification
- Registered Club colours and approved helmets and riding boots must be worn. Arm bands must be worn
- Competitors must compete at their assessed level.
- No Protests.

What will you need

You will need a course of minimum jumping efforts. 2 Spread and 2 Vertical fences must be included. You may use your own arena & jumps, a lesson (but your coach should NOT be communicating with you during your round), a freshmans/training day or competition footage.

Please note as per HRCav Show Jumping Rule 13.3 "The back element of a spread fence must only consist of one (1) pole." Therefore you may NOT build a spread that can be jumped in both directions. You MAY jump verticals both ways.

Start & Finish lines should be marked

Scoring

Like the 'Collectives' for Dressage. Each round will be scored according to the official score sheet which can be found here
