To be a welcoming and inclusive association that fosters community through clubs, values riders, celebrates volunteers, and champions horse welfare.






## Our Mission

We support a strong network of clubs to promote participation, learning and enjoyment in equestrian sport, grounded in inclusivity and horse welfare.



## Governance and Sustainability

Ensure ethical and sustainable practices within our equestrian community

- Maintain a balanced annual budget with a surplus target of \$50,000 annually
- By 2026 ensure all sub-committees have updated Terms of Reference
- By 2026 implement a formal induction process for all new Executive and sub-committee members
- By end of 2026 conduct a comprehensive audit of Chaff Chat balancing cost, accessibility, and value to members.
- By end of 2026 develop role descriptions and communication clarity for Executive sub-committees and members.
- By the end of 2026 complete a comprehensive review and restructure of the current HRCAV manual.

## Strong Clubs, Volunteers & Officials

HRCAV is built on its clubs and powered by volunteers and officials

- By 2028 increase the number of accredited officials by 20% through training and recognition programs.
- Design and deliver two workshops annually for club committees on governance, volunteer management, and risk management.
- By 2026 Introduce a volunteer and official recognition program that highlights contributions at club and association level.





## Horse Welfare

Horse welfare is at the heart of everything we do

- By 2026 embed a welfare clause into all event rules and guidelines so "horses first" is nonnegotiable.
- Design and deliver a minimum of three horse welfare education initiatives annually.
- By 2027 provide 100% of HRCAV accredited officials with welfare training.

## Member Engagement

HRCAV is more than competitions — it's community

- By 2027 increase member engagement in social media platforms by 50% through targeted and consistent, professional content design and delivery.
- By 2028 increase membership by 10% through targeted recruitment and retention strategies.
- By 2027 complete a full audit of the HRCAV awards structure, with recommendations to ensure awards are fair, inclusive, and aligned with member values and horse welfare.
- By mid 2026 complete a redesign the HRCAV website to improve accessibility, professionalism, and member engagement.
- By end 2026 develop a comprehensive Style Guide to apply to all HRCAV documents and communications: member facing, internal, and public facing.
- By 2027 develop a sponsorship prospectus to attract corporate and community partners.
